# Outlive Yourself

befriended Tara Storch last year. She is an incredible woman who turned an unimaginable tragedy into a mission of hope. Read more as our contributor Laura Frnka Davis shares her family's story of hope and faith. - Stacy Bynes

Each year in the middle of November is the National Donor Sabbath, a weekend set aside to educate faith-based communities about the need for organ, eye, and tissue donors.

For one Texas couple, the observance provides another platform and meaningful way to share the story of their daughter, Taylor, who saved and healed the lives of others when she gave the gift of life to others 12 years ago.

It was Spring Break 2010 when Tara and Todd Storch were enjoying a skiing trip to Beaver, Colorado, with their three children. Taylor (13), Ryan (11), and Peyton (9). Their lives changed forever with the last ski run on their first day on the slopes. Although Taylor was an accomplished athlete wearing a helmet, she lost control and hit a tree. The weather prohibited a medevac flight to Denver, so Taylor was flown to Grand Junction, Colorado, Consequently, the family had to make the excruciating two-and-a-half-hour drive to be with Taylor at the hospital.

Thinking back to that day at the hospital, Tara admits to being in shock and recalls the confusion as they spoke with orthopedic surgeons and neurosurgeons. However, a moment Tara remembers clearly is when a nurse walked into Taylor's room and knelt beside her. With compassion, she said that Taylor was a beautiful candidate for organ donation and gently asked if the family would consider it.

"She made the most gentle and loving ask of Taylor and us. There was no pressure," said Tara. And knowing how giving Taylor was in life, the ultimate decision to donate her organs was an easy decision for Storches. They said yes, which sparked life for five individuals waiting on a heart, kidneys, pancreas, liver, and cornea.



After their daughter's death, Tara and Todd founded Taylor's Gift Foundation with the initial goal of encouraging more people to "outlive themselves" by registering as donors. Today, the foundation's focus has grown to serve a different purpose: providing cost-free emotional and grief support for families of organ donors through their Kindred Hearts Program.

"Taylor's Gift Foundation is honored to offer this free support so that no donor family ever grieves alone." Throughout their own grief journey, the Storches have relied heavily on their faith, which is why National Donor Sabbath is so meaningful to them.

"All major religions in the United States support organ, eye, and tissue donation as an unselfish act of love and charity," said Tara. "If you haven't made a decision about if you'd like to be a donor, we encourage you to talk to your faith leader about it to learn more."

This year's National Donor Sabbath is from Friday, November 11, through Sunday, November 13.

Clara's Tea, on Sunday, December 4, 2022 at Safari Texas, will be the official start of The Nutcracker season for BalletForte, Fort Bend county's premier classical ballet company. BalletForte is a nonprofit arts organization whose mission is to increase awareness of the arts and classical ballet through master classes and affordable performances for the local community. Clara's Tea is a fundraiser event, hosted by the BalletForte Guild, an organization of strictly volunteers working to augment the mission and support the dancers of BalletForte.

The star of Clara's Tea is, of course Clara, the heroine of The Nutcracker in a Nutshell performance at Clara's Tea as well as

Emmalynne Brown (13), Kyra Cadungog (13), Lily Gardenour (15), and Sofia Grovas (14) will each get to play the leading role of Clara this year under the leadership and guidance of Michael Banigan, BalletForte's Artistic Director and founder. Brown said, "when I was six years old, my mom took me to see Clara's Tea. I remember being enchanted by all the dancers and the yummy food and desserts. Now, I can't believe I will be a part of the show!"

In addition to the performance at Clara's Tea, BalletForte hosts Title I schools in Fort Bend ISD, Lamar Consolidated ISD and Stafford Municipal SD for special outreach and service project performances of The Nutcracker at the Stafford Center. The general public will have to wait until opening night on December 9th to experience BalletForte's The Nutcracker. injury. But, I am motivated to work hard and succeed. I am learning the choreography and perfecting my technique." We are literally from the middle of nowhere. We live outside of a tiny town, population 200, in Southeast Kansas, close to where I grew up, and returned to raise my three amazing children. I can't even remember how long I have been coming to the Houston Nutcracker Market, 15-20 years? The Houston Nutcracker and the Houston Rodeo are the highlights of our year. Seeing all our customers, who have literally become our friends, is my favorite part of my job! That should tell you something, I only do three retail shows a year, and two are in Houston! We love Houston.

#### How did you get started? Where do you get your inspiration?

My Mother has always known I was going to be an artist. She has saved crayon drawings from as young as three, of my favorite things to draw at the time: embarrassingly, they are of Queens, smoking cigarettes. Ugh. In grade school while other kids were getting toys, I wanted a subscription to the craft of the month club. My dear grandmother who consistently encouraged me, owned a ceramics business. She wasn't good at detailed painting, so after school, I would go to her house and paint all the eyes, eyelashes, lips, etc. on all her ceramic creations. At ten years old, I turned my parents screened porch into an art show, where I sold my crafts that I am sure were terrible! But to this day, I still remember my very first sale. I thank the Lord to this day Ms. Vera Rudasill, our Avon lady, for purchasing that painted red plaster poured paperweight from my art show. That act of kindness not only gave me the encouragement to set me on my artistic career, but gave me a life long lesson that I still hold dear to my heart. My entire home is decorated with art from artists I have found on my journeys through life. Not only do I want to pass on that encouraging turn point in my life, but my home is a colorful happy place with every inch covered in happy moments and wonderful art.

After graduating from the University of Kansas, there were bills to pay, so I took several jobs, but I was still creating. I started painting on clothing that got the attention of my office colleagues, who began purchasing. My evenings became busy

painting clothing, which began my business. My advice has always been the same to all who ask me: Do what you love, even if it's a side gig, when that side job begins to take over and you can't keep up, it's time..... That is exactly what happened to me. My inspiration comes from everywhere. Never stop learning. I love learning new techniques and any art or craft out there! Everything I learn, culminates into my art, in some form or another. I love it all: sewing, painting, ceramics, macramé, scrapbooking, tie dye, woodworking, silversmithing, stained glass, sculpture, batik, woodburning, beading, embroidery, knitting, paper crafts, etc.

# Who is part of your crew, and what does it take to get set up, then packed up?

My studio gang includes lots of family, my 75 year old mother and my 21 year old daughter work with me each and every day. My right hand Kelsey, whom I love like a daughter, has worked with me for over 10 years. I literally have the best crew at home who continues to handle everything for me while I am on the road also. Not only do I love my job, I love my crew!

I have a love/hate relationship with set up and tear down. I LOVE setting up. We have such an elaborate booth set up, it

takes 4-6 people, Four 10-12 hour days, that is approximately 500 hours of set up. But it's the possibilities I love. We never seem to set up the same way any time. It is taking an empty 300-400sq ft space, and turning it into a magical place for me. More than once, I've been setting up our display, and other vendors have come by and said "we love your booth and your products!" And I say, "Thank you but I haven't put out anything I sell yet! That's just my display." Now for the hate part: teardown. It always seems to have to be at impossible speeds, we have to be out by a certain times, we have to pack up in 4 hours what took 4 days to create, then try to get it all to fit back onto a trailer, when everyone is exhausted and crabby from working long hours for days without breaks, or getting to sit down, etc. I would rather skip this part altogether and just stay until next year, LOL!

#### What do you do when you aren't being creative and working?

That's a tough one. Anyone who knows and owns their own business knows it's never a 9-5 job. When I'm at home in the studio, it's more like a 7am-8pmjob, then I take work inside after dinner and work on my couch while binge watching something until bedtime. I've had days before deadlines or shows, where I work till 3am, sleep til 7, and get up and do it again for weeks on end. But, I LOVE MY JOB, and my life. so I never feel like it's "work". It's what I want to do, all the time. I love creating new pieces, coming up with new designs, and that will NEVER get old for me.

What free time I have, I love to cook, bake, canning my homemade salsas, pizza sauce, apple butter, etc, I love to read mostly dystopian books (Sarah J Maas is one of my favorites), lay in the sun (yes I know it's bad for you but it makes me happy), eating at family owned delicious restaurants and dives, playing with our 2 Frenchies, (Beans and Banx), decorating and spending time with kids and my new Grandbaby!

#### What are five things you ALWAYS keep in your purse?

Lip balm, hand sanitizer that smells good (can't stand the gross kind that smells like straight tequila), an extra bottle of diet soda (diet dr pepper addict), usually a phone cord that I've forgotten the box to charge with, and a hair clip for the hot flashes!

#### Tell us something you want our readers to know!

My cup will always be 1/2 full, never 1/2 empty. Even on bad days, tomorrow is a new and exciting day, and the possibilities are endless. God is Good, and I am very blessed. ### The Best Thing I Ever Ate



The grocery store shelves are missing poultry seasoning, sage, and cinnamon' a sure indicator that you probably need a break from cooking, and your taste buds need relief from the holiday fare. There are many legendary as well as new locally owned restaurants in our community; knowing what to order or trying something new can be a challenge. I asked Commonwealth neighbor and owner of Off the Vine Bistro Namita Asthana; longtime restaurateur and owner of La Cocina Mexican Restaurant in Richmond Andres Novoa, and Danita Carey, owner of Carey's Frozen Delights in Missouri City to tell us about the best thing they ever at from their own restaurants.

Off the Vine Bistro's locally sourced and scratch cooked dishes bring foodies from all over for a unique dining experience with our neighbors and proprietors Namita and Manish Asthana. The entire menu was created by Namita and is as delicious as it is unique. Namita says that the best thing she ever ate from her own kitchen at the restaurant are the bacon wrapped feta-stuffed dates with local honey and garlic. The salty bacon paired with the pungent feta, spicy garlic and sweet dates and honey cover the entire taste palette! They are the perfect intro to a hearty meal. Be sure to ask Namita for a great wine to pair with them!

La Cocina Mexican restaurant is known for its authentic Tex-Mex including hand-made flour tortillas and fabulous margaritas. Of the many fresh and delicious items on the menu of this very popular spot, Andres says the best thing he ever ate from his very own grill are the Street tacos (beef, chicken or pork) and the La Sirena; a grilled chicken breast stuffed with baby shrimp, Monterey Jack and Ranchera sauce topped with sautéed mushrooms, cilantro butter sauce. Both are so popular we bent the rules a bit and were okay with letting him recommend two dishes!

"My years at Make-A-Wish were some of the most rewarding years of my career. I loved how we could pull together to make any wish – even those that seemed impossible




 happen," said Teri. "The organization does much to enrich the human experience with hope, strength, and joy, and it was an honor and privilege to serve as CEO."
